Course Description: Over 20 years ago, Texas AFT launched its campaign for a Safe Schools Act to put a stop to violent and disruptive behavior in the classroom. The Texas Legislature enacted the law in 1995 by creating The Safe Schools Act, which is contained in Chapter 37, Sections 37.001-37.022 of the Education Code. How can a teacher request the permanent removal of a disruptive student? What must the principal do and what can the principal not do? The law is not self-enforcing. The teacher must start the process to use the law and must insist that the principal follow the law.
